NCSA Meeting Minutes, October 18, 1992 at Go-Getters Pizza.

In attendance: Jim Minami, Greg and Mary Wong, Chris Buja, Bonnie Crater, Carleen Loveday, John Heemskirk, Cornelia Bagg, Paul Albert, Derek Roberts.

ASU business: reimbursement from ASU for ice time of ACEP Coaching Clinic (was received Monday after the meeting.) Money goes to Golden Gate Club. A letter from Shirley Yates asks all clubs to get their membership information to her as soon as possible so she doesn't get an avalance of applications just when racing season starts.

Association business:

President: Mary Wong proposed need for committees for RACING and FINANCE. Group voted to form a racing committee to handle all aspects of putting on races, whether NCSA has only one club or more. This committee will be headed by Jim Minami. Formation of a finance committee was postponed at this time. Regarding NCSA incorporation; the Secretary of State's office returned the application, asking that a simple change be made on page 1, of the Articles of Incorporation. This was done and the package was returned for their approval. We are hoping that she likes page 2, and so on. (Editor's note: She didn't. Another correction was made and package sent back with a letter asking the document examiner to review the whole package before returning it for corrections.)

Vice-president: Bonnie Crater reported that NCSA currently has about 15 members. Membership sheets were made available at this meeting, and will be available at sessions. Membership cards were distributed. You are registered with the ASU and NCSA as soon as you send in your money, but you need your ASU card to race outside this association area. You should start receiving the RACING BLADE magazine soon after you are registered.

Treasurer: Carleen Loveday will open an association bank account. She is looking for one that will be free. Bonnie will also have a signature on file.

Club announcements and business: Jim Minami reported on efforts to secure GGSS club ice time at Fashion Island. Jim was trying to suggest to the rink ways to lower the ice cost. Glen considered Jim's proposal that Ice Capades sponsor GGSS, but ended up turning it down, saying they don't want to sponsor other groups. They will not allow GGSS skaters to pay "throught the door" at this session, the way skaters now pay \$5 each on Sundays. Ice costs \$160/hr.+. GGSS would need a minimum of 16 skaters paying \$10 each per hour to pay for a private session. Jim maintains that a serious racing club needs more than one session per week. (Lane County club in Eugene, OR is running three sessions per week at their county-owned facility. LA is running three sessions per week.)

Fund Raiser: Ron Heemskerk brought sample coupon checkbooks that will be sold by club members for \$8 apiece. There are separate zones for the east bay, peninsula and the south bay. Ron says there is even a coupon for Ice Capades Chalet. GGSS can keep \$4 for each book sold. Skaters are encouraged to sign up to take a couple books for each zone to sell at their workplace as well as to family and friends. Bonnie, Chris, Greg and Mary each offered to take five books to start with. Books will be available at the sessions. Skate-athon date undecided while we wait for corporate status to be secured.
